  - (2) two-hour realm meetings each month on Wednesday nights from 6:00-8:00pm
  - Student Leadership retreat in the summer of 2019 (July 12-14)
  - Fall Forward, Christmas Party, Spring Banquet and Graduates' Breakfast
  - Conducting Student Lifecycle Interviews in the spring of 2020
